

## WHAT TO BRING TO IKENOBO CLASS

The following list of materials is suggested for all students attending any class given by the Ikebana Ikenobo Naples Chapter. Please plan to arrive at the lesson site no later than 11:15AM to set up and be prepared for the lesson to begin at 11:30. The class usually ends around 3PM and students need to help clean up the room prior to leaving.

Gravel or small pebbles	For raising kenzan in vase to higher level. Must be small sized gravel not stones	<a href="#">Available at Level I classes for \$5.</a> Aquarium gravel from pet supply store; Wash before using

Mat or small plastic tarp	To protect table surface while working on arrangement	Hardware or beach supply store or Wal-Mart; a plastic shower curtain liner cut in half works.
Garbage bag	To dispose of your clippings	Recycle a paper bag or plastic from your shopping
Towels, cloth or paper	For clean up	Your home

Vinyl Tape	Clear, waterproof	Contact <a href="#">Daniela Klecan</a> ; must have for all Rikka classes
Wire	18" green in 16, <b>18, 20, 22, 25, 26</b> gauge	Contact <a href="#">Daniela Klecan</a> ; must have for all Rikka classes
Wire cutters and pliers	Must be able to cut wire; it ruins your hasami	Hardware stores; Home Depot or Ikebana Naples Ginza (limited); must have for all Rikka classes <a href="#">Ikenobo equipment website</a>
Cash or checkbook	To pay for items purchased or you can Zelle or Venmo the funds

Floral Tape	For attaching and hiding wire	Available at <a href="#">Ikenobo Naples Ginza Michaels</a>
Stem Tape	For wicking water up to stems that have been mechanically extended	Available at <a href="#">Ikenobo Naples Ginza Michaels</a>
Scissor cleaner	To clean and slightly sharpen your hasami	Ikebana International #160 Ginza <a href="#">Available at Ikenobo Naples Ginza Ikenobo Equipment website</a>
Band Aids	Scissors and wires are sharp	Drug store
Travel size hand lotion	To remove pine tar from hands	Drug store
Kenzans, other	Ashitsuki (has stem for anchoring into gravel – this keeps the kenzan from sliding around)	<a href="#">Available at Ikenobo Naples Ginza (limited)</a> <a href="#">Ikenobo Equipment website</a>
Wire Case	Very handy for keeping that wire straight. An 18-20” piece of PVC pipe also works	<a href="#">Available at Ikenobo Naples Ginza (Limited)</a> <a href="#">Ikenobo Equipment website</a>
Pin straightener	Cleans the kenzan and straightens bent pins	<a href="#">Available at Ikenobo Naples Ginza (limited)</a> <a href="#">Ikenobo Equipment website</a>
Ukezutsu and chop sticks	Small, medium and large copper water holders for Rikka; chop sticks for extending height of ukezutsu	Available at <a href="#">Ikenobo Naples Ginza Ikenobo equipment website</a>
Large clippers	For larger plant material, branches	Hardware or garden stores
Small sharp scissors	For trimming leaves and other material	Wal-Mart or Target
Cotton Balls	For use when extending stems that need water	Drug store
